

UPDATED NOTICE

November 30, 2020

The Center for Alcohol and Drug Treatment (CADT) has a responsibility to protect the safety, health and welfare of all clients, staff, volunteers, service providers and the public. To mitigate the impact of the current community health crisis, the following measures are being implemented immediately and will remain in effect until rescinded in writing:

- NO visitation is allowed at this time, unless special circumstances. Clients in residential programming can make arrangements for virtual visits by talking with the Treatment Director. CADT is complying with government recommended social distancing to reduce the spread of disease.
- Professional visitors will be limited to personal physician, religious adviser, county case manager, parole or probation officer, and attorney. These visits must be pre-arranged with the Treatment Director.
- All visitors, patients, staff, interns, and contracted personnel are required to wear a mask when on site at any CADT program or department. A mask will be provided as needed. Covid screenings including temperatures will be required.
- Contract personnel will continue to perform duties unless directed otherwise by their parent organization. Contract personnel should not enter the facility if they are ill, symptomatic or have an elevated temperature.
- ALL volunteer services are hereby suspended until further notice. No volunteer shall be permitted contact with clients without advance authorization of the Treatment Director.

The impact of these restrictions to clients and employees are recognized, however measures to reduce the risk to the clients, employees and organization dictate unusual and impacting measures to limit potential impact to all concerned. Updates to these measures will be provided as changes occur.
